



A Message From Our Supervisor...

While nobody looks forward to receiving a property tax bill, I have some very good news to report regarding our Township!

FINANCES

In 2015, Grand Blanc Township retiree healthcare costs were only 13% funded with a total liability of \$41 million. When the current Township Board was seated in 2020, they made this issue a priority and took action to reduce unfunded liabilities. Through negotiations with our six employee unions and fiscally responsible budgeting, the fiscal year 2023 actuarial report from Foster & Foster showed the Township's retiree healthcare costs are 95.97% funded! Municipalities all over our country are struggling to catch up with legacy costs that keep growing. Unfunded retiree liabilities are the cause of townships and cities having to raise taxes just to pay the compounding annual interest. Grand Blanc Township's future will be much more secure by having these liabilities continue to be a priority.

RECREATION/ MULTI-USE PATHWAYS

Over the past three and half years, we have invested over \$4 million dollars in recreation. It was recently announced that we have been successful earning nearly \$1.5 million in grants for the continued funding of our Grand Blanc Township Non-Motorized Pathway Plan. The plan covers the entire Township and is being built primarily with State and local grants. Additionally, a new playground at Creasey Bicentennial Park was constructed at the beginning of the summer. This playground features new ADA accessible and sensory-friendly elements. Summer Infrastructure Projects

We have a few major infrastructure projects that will be active in the second half of this year:

- The Fenton Road Sanitary Sewer Upgrade Project taking place on Fenton Road, between Sarah Street and Cook Road. Zito Construction will be doing the work and it will be a several month-long project.
- The CDMSI Water Service Verification Program will take place from June-September. We will be excavating 340 water service lines in random locations throughout the Township to verify their material composition in the road right-of-way and inspections will be taking place at the meter. This is mandated by the EPA and EGLE.
- Genesee County Road Commission (GCRC) resurfaced Saginaw St., from McCandlish to I-75 this summer. They will widen Grand Blanc Road from Porter to Fenton Road and rebuild Cook Road between Holly and Embury Roads. Wishing Well Estates S.A.D. Road Project is also planned for summer 2024.

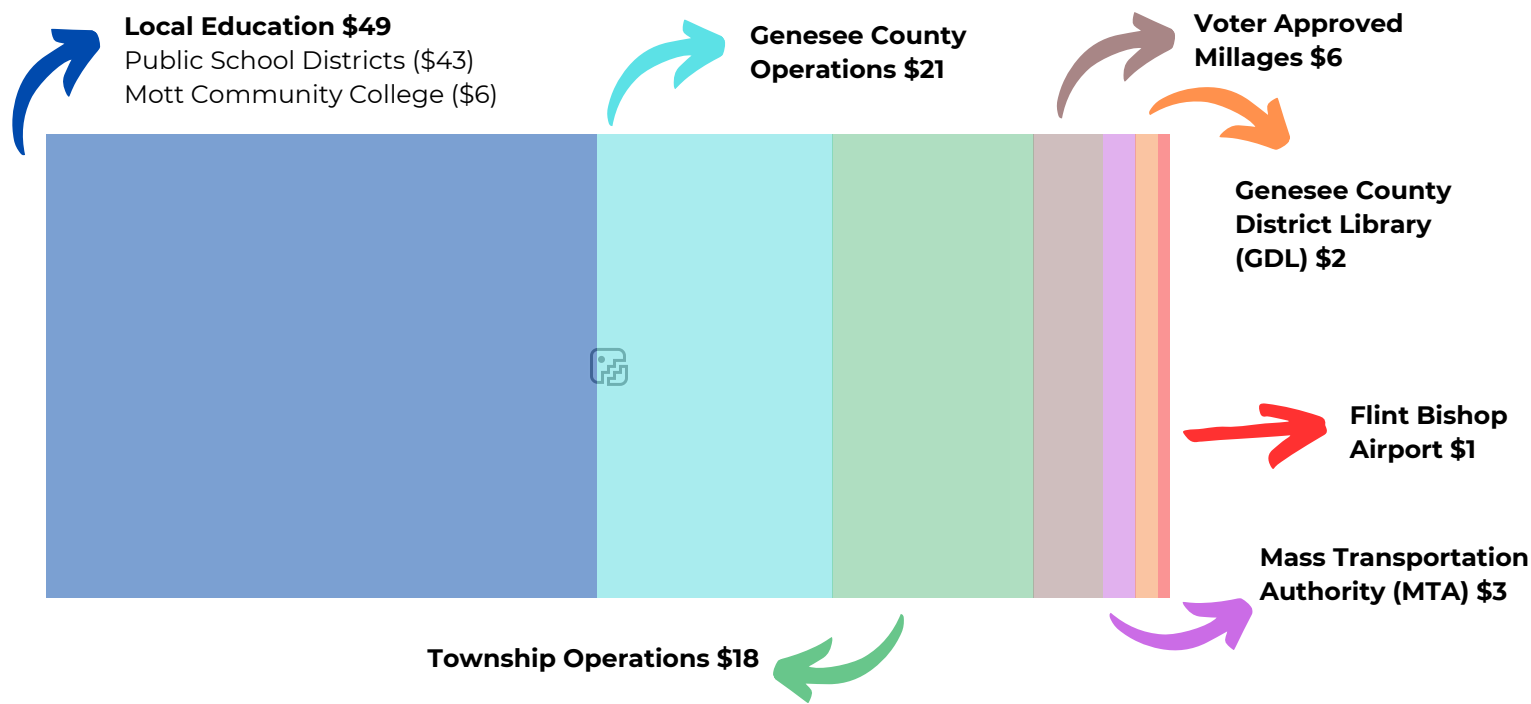
Fire

Happy Summer! If you choose to have a campfire, or recreational fire, please be responsible! Campfires consist of burning only seasoned firewood (no leaves or grass clippings) for pleasure, cooking, warmth, or similar purposes. They must not exceed 3 feet wide by 2 feet long and must be extinguished by 1:00 a.m. Additionally, campfires must not be left to smolder overnight. You must keep a fire extinguishing agent, such as a garden hose) present and readily available and keep fire at least 25 feet from a structure or combustible material. Township residents do not need a permit for campfires.

You can always find guidelines and rules for outdoor burning and campfires on the Township website. Have a safe summer!
