Summer took a while to arrive and now let's enjoy it!

Your Grand Blanc Township Board and staff are working diligently to improve our existing parks and recreation facilities and to provide new amenities like pickleball courts. **Vibrant parks and non-motorized pathways** provide both immediate and lasting benefits to our community by attracting sporting events, individuals and families who support our local restaurants, shops, and service providers. Over the long term, our parks contribute to a healthier, more desirable community.

We are very pleased to announce that we received a **\$600,000 grant from the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation to assist us with expanding our trail network**. This funding will support Phase II of the Perry Road Trail (\$270,000) and the Embury Cook Road Trail (\$330,000), closing key gaps. These projects will help connect more of the Township and provide more outdoor recreation. On average, building a path costs \$1 million per mile. A huge thank you to the Mott Foundation for its continued support and investment in our region's quality of life.

The condition of your subdivision streets impacts home values and community appeal. In Michigan, the County Road Commissions own and maintain all streets and roads located in townships. Subdivision streets can only be repaved or rebuilt through a resident-initiated process known as a Special Assessment District (S.A.D.). Grand Blanc Township is home to some of the largest and oldest subdivision streets in the County, and the cost to replace or repair these roads has continued to rise each year. Continued on back...

Summer Infrastructure Projects

We are currently in the process of changing out water meters that are at the end of their life cycle. We have partnered with Blue-Water Solutions (formally SLC) to do these meter changes. The new meters will give residents more information on water usage and help find leaky faucets early to avoid large bills. If your water meter is part of this upgrade, you will receive a letter from Blue-Water Solutions notifying you to make an appointment for this change. We anticipate the project will be completed by December of 2026.

Our crews are busy doing routine cleaning and televising of the sanitary sewer system throughout the Township. This is a preventative maintenance (PM) item that keeps our systems flowing and detects any issues within the system for repairs. The crews will place signage at subdivision entrances before work starts in your area. We also have crews operating the water valves and trimming around hydrants as part of our PM schedule.

The new DPW/FD building is well underway, our contractors are making great progress on this new building. If you travel Dort Hwy you can see there are several trades working to complete this project.

Trash, Recycling & Compost

Trash, recycling, and compost will be collected every Wednesday throughout July and August. Emterra will start pickups at 7:00 a.m. and may work until 8:00 p.m. to ensure all items are retrieved. If your trash, recycling, or compost has not been collected by 8:00 p.m., please reach out to our office at 810-424-2600 ext. 2906 the following morning. We will coordinate with Emterra to investigate the reason for the missed pickup.
